

## Quick Guide Bluetooth Music Receiver WM-BTMIC29


### Compatible with the following models:

- Honda Civic from year 2006 to 2013
- Honda CRV from year 2008 to 2013
- Honda Accord (8-Generation) from year 2008 to 2013

### Connect the adapter:

1. Remove the radio (you will find various instructions on the Internet).
2. Before you disconnect the plugs from the radio, make sure that you have the radio code available to you, as you may need it for the radio after the power interruption.
3. Disconnect the 20 pin connector from the radio. If external devices such as a CD changer are present, this cannot be used afterwards.
4. Insert the 20 pole extender of the WM-BTMIC29 into the provided connector behind the radio.

5. Now connect the black ground cable to the radio housing or the black cable directly to a ground cable to the radio connection (usually a thick brown cable). Without a good ground connection the function of the adapter is not given.
6. Now connect the red cable (ignition plus +12V) to a switched +12V line (measurement with multimeter necessary). Ignition on = +12V on / ignition off = 0V on.
7. Position the microphone near the driver in the vehicle (steering wheel fairing, dashboard, etc.). The cable is then routed to the Bluetooth adapter and connected to the microphone input. **Avoid placing the microphone in the immediate vicinity of or on airbags.**
8. Establish a Bluetooth connection by enabling Bluetooth pairing and searching for the Bluetooth device ``WM``. You should then set the volume on the connected device to full volume.
9. Before reinstalling the radio, test the function of the adapter. Switch on the AUX function using the CD/AUX button on the radio.

### For Info!

AUX must be enabled and selectable on the radio. If this is not the case, it must be activated in a specialist workshop.
